 **Tip:**

- **-s:** Add to most verbs for **he, she, it** (e.g., he walks, she talks).
- **-es:** Add to verbs ending in **-ch, -sh, -ss, -x, -z, -o** (e.g., he watches, she goes).
- **-ies:** Change **-y** to **-ies** if the verb ends in consonant + **y** (e.g., he tries, she carries).
- **-ys:** If the verb ends in vowel + **y**, just add **-s** (e.g., she plays, he stays).

- **Most verbs** → **add -ing** (e.g., eat → eating, go → going).
- **Verb ends in silent -e** → **drop -e, add -ing** (e.g., make → making, write → writing).
- **One syllable, consonant + vowel + consonant** → **double final consonant, add -ing** (e.g., sit → sitting, stop → stopping).
- **Verb ends in -ie** → **change to -y, add -ing** (e.g., lie → lying, die → dying).
- **Verb ends in -w, -x, -y** → **just add -ing** (e.g., fix → fixing, play → playing).
- **Two syllables, stress on last syllable** → **double final consonant, add -ing** (e.g., begin → beginning, forget → forgetting).
